## Baby Blocks, Infant

Shown are instructions for 3 different views for this pattern. This is an easy to make quilt, made up of 25 blocks and a border. Depending on the finished look you desire, the center can be 3 different fabrics, 5 different fabrics or 25 different fabric scraps.

Fabric requirements:
Blocks - cut fabric or scraps into a total of $25-6^{\prime \prime} \times 6^{\prime \prime}$ squares [about 1 yard total]
Border - $2 / 3$ yard, cut 4 strips, each $6^{\prime \prime}$ wide by $42 / 44^{\prime \prime}$
Backing $-41^{\prime \prime} \times 41^{\prime \prime}$
Batting - 41" $\times 41^{\prime \prime}$
Finished size approximately $381 / 2$ " $\times 381 / 2$ "

## Construction

Using a $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ seam for construction, sew 5 rows of 5 blocks each, together. Press seams. Sew the 5 rows together and press seams using ease of construction. Add side borders, press and trim. Add top and bottom borders, press \& trim.

This blanket can be finished using the traditional method, which uses a binding, or the 'envelope' method, which uses no binding. Quilt or tie at least every $31 / 2$ to 4 inches. Quilting in the ditch looks nice and reinforces the blanket. Quilting $1 / 2$ " around the outside edges gives a more finished look when using the 'envelope' method.
