Congratulations to AZB4K volunteer Ellie Gill. She purchased the winning ticket for our 2005 Raffle Quilt! The drawing was held at Craftmart in Chandler on March 26 and Ellie was presented with her prize at Cutting Edge Quiltworks in Chandler on March 29. Ellie found our organization after retiring as a Social Studies teacher at Dobson High School in May of 2000. In January of 2001, Ellie attended a quilting bee for AZ Blankets at Cutting Edge Quiltworks. Previously, Ellie's sewing time was spent on clothing, upholstery and drapery. She had also made costumes for Mesa Community College.

Besides the satisfaction of providing AZ Kids with warm and cozy blankets, Ellie was drawn to the friendship and camaraderie of AZB4K volunteers. She says that our events are always welcoming and full of friendly faces coming together to do good work.

"I was stunned!", she said, when asked about her first reaction upon hearing she had won the raffle quilt. Ellie had purchased the tickets and taken them home to fill out and mail in. She was planning a trip to Australia (which included quilting classes) and mailed

Many thanks to these two quilters for sharing their time and talents to create this unique and beautiful quilt for us.

Louise Haley - Quilting Artist

Louise Haley (left, with inset of quilting detail from this year's raffle quilt) has provided AZ Blankets with her incredible quilting talents since we began our raffle quilt fund raisers. She has been our quilt artist for three raffles now.

Coming from a family of sewers, both grandmothers especially, Louise grew up in an environment where needlework was plentiful. As a teenager, Louise saw a denim quilt on the cover of a magazine and had to make it. Next were crazy quilts, then quilting classes, and finally a start in hand quilting. She began free-motion quilting on her Bernina sewing machine, then moved into long-arm machine quilting, where she can accommodate larger quilts.

The level of detail in the quilting Louise has done for us is truly incredible. When asked how she comes up with the quilting design she said, "Some of the quilts start talking to me right away. Others are tougher and I ask myself questions about what would work best. I always take ownership of the quilt and make it the way I would want my quilt to be."

On March 15, during our Spring Blanket Bee, Courtney Kutta, V.P. and Co-Founder of Community C.A.R.E. Connections, Inc., explained what AZ Blankets does for their organization and what CCC Inc. does for your community.

Their mission fulfills crucial needs for highly vulnerable and disadvantaged individuals, helping them achieve a life of independence. They accomplish this by connecting those in need with those who can help. They focus their attention on women and children, victims of domestic violence, homebound seniors, low-income populations and volunteerism.

Blankets for Community C.A.R.E. Connections, Inc. are placed primarily within two of their programs: Assistance for Victims of Domestic Violence (AVDV) and the Medical Volunteer Program (MVP). Children who are victims of domestic violence are often given one of our blankets in a shelter where they have the help and hope to make a new start. One task of the MVP is to provide assistance for teen pregnancy and family planning. Classes for expecting moms who are in financial or emotional crisis receive a "getting started" package which includes one of our blankets.
